The Fourth Sunday of Easter is traditionally called "Good Shepherd Sunday." The image is taken from the Gospel reading which always comes from the tenth chapter of the Gospel according to John. In that

chapter, Jesus gives a discourse where he identifies himself as "the Good Shepherd."

The image of Jesus as the good shepherd is one of the most enduring images of Jesus. In the earliest Christian art, for example in the catacombs in Rome, Jesus is depicted as a shepherd who is carrying a lamb on his neck. This image of Jesus may well be the oldest and most continuously used form in religious art. Even here at Sacred Heart, our statue of Jesus near the confessional is a close imitation of the early Roman versions of the good shepherd.

We live in a culture that does not have a lot of shepherds. While shepherds are commonplace throughout much of the world, we do not see them very frequently in Connecticut. One reality of shepherds is the closeness they have with their flocks. In order to care for a flock well, you have to know all of the sheep, their personalities, the ones who are stubborn, the ones who are scared, and the ones who will run over a cliff. You have to look out for the ones who are mistreated by others. You have to be strict with the aggressive ones. It is not just sitting on a hill, reading a book, while enjoying pastoral peace. Shepherding requires personal investment, gentleness, and a firm will.

On Good Shepherd Sunday, we rejoice that Jesus is the good shepherd. He knows us, he leads us, and he directs our wandering hearts. We are not left to our own devices. We belong to him. God is not indifferent, in Jesus, God has come very close to us.
