Happy Easter! The Easter season is now in full swing. The glory of the resurrection is to infuse our prayer and life. Just as the discipline of Lent – the self-restraint, soberness, and sacrifice – marked the preparation for Easter, so the rejoicing of the resurrection – joy, lightness, and generosity – mark the Easter season.

It is interesting how Catholics will make effort to observe Lent well but not give as much thought to celebrating Easter well.

It is with joy that I will be here for the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. Because I was away at school, I was prevented from celebrating our patronal feast day with the parish. This year, we are going to celebrate the Sacred Heart in style. There is going to be a whole weekend dedicated to joyful prayer, community outreach, and being a family of faith.

I want us to prepare for the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart with intention. This will be done through a novena of Friday devotions. A novena simply comes from the Latin word for "nine." It comes from the nine days between the Ascension and Pentecost when the disciples prayed for the coming of the Holy Spirit. There is a beautiful tradition of preparing for something important by reserving nine days. Thus, I want each of us to take the next nine Fridays and prepare for the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart.

Enclosed in the bulletin is the novena prayer for the first week. This novena to the Sacred Heart incorporates the history of the devotion through the various Saints who have been devoted to the Sacred Heart of Jesus.

On Friday mornings, after the 8:00 mass, I will lead the novena prayer in the church. I invite everyone to join for the prayer in the church or to pray on your own on Friday. Each Sunday, we will publish the next week of the novena prayers. Please join us. Together we can celebrate this Easter season with joy, lightness, and generosity while growing in devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus.
