



4TH OF JULY

Our morning Mass on Thursday, July 4th will be held at **9:00 a.m**. Please note, the office will be closed. We hope you have a safe and enjoyable holiday.





Mass this weekend is a special commemoration. June 29th is the Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul – it is the day when the church honors the martyrdom of these two great Saints. Both Saints are drawn from Jerusa-

lem to Rome where they were martyred – Paul by the sword and Peter by crucifixion.

This Solemnity is the day when newly appointed archbishops are summoned to Rome to celebrate Mass with the Pope. At this Mass, in accordance with an ancient custom, a liturgical vestment called a *pallium* is conferred to new archbishops. This vestment is a woolen yoke that is worn around the neck during Mass – it is an ancient symbol that signifies the archbishop is "yoked" to Christ. As we hear in the Gospel according to Matthew, "Come to me all who are heavily burdened...my yoke is easy and my burden light." The *pallium* symbolizes how all of the archbishops and the pope (who also wears a *pallium*) are to be unified by being in close communion with Christ and each other.

Since Hartford is an archdiocese, a new archbishop of Hartford makes a pilgrimage to Rome to receive the *pallium* as a sign of unity. Thus, Archbishop Coyne is making his pilgrimage this weekend.

Since the Solemnity of Peter and Paul falls on a Saturday this year (June 29th) and most parishes in the archdiocese do not celebrate Saturday morning Masses, Archbishop Coyne has asked that we observe the Solemnity of Peter and Paul on Sunday that all the archdiocese may be united in praying for unity in the Church and that he might be fittingly yoked to our Lord Jesus Christ in his ministry as our shepherd. In your charity, please pray a little extra for Archbishop Coyne this weekend that he will be truly yoked to Jesus Christ.

HOW TO REPORT AN INCIDENT OF SEXUAL ABUSE TO THE ARCHDIOCESE OF HARTFORD

If you have knowledge or suspect that a minor or vulnerable adult (an adult with an intellectual disability) has been sexually abused, in any manner, by personnel of the Archdiocese of Hartford, you are urged to report this information to:

In addition, you will be asked to follow up in writing with a detailed description of the facts involved in the incident. Specifics of this written report can be found in the <u>Policies and Procedures of the Archdiocese of Hartford Relating to Allegations of Sexual Misconduct Involving Minors and Vulnerable Adults</u>. This document is also available online at <u>www.archdioceseofhartford.org</u>. The Archdiocese of Hartford will report any and all incidents to the proper civil authorities.

Mandated reporters in the State of Connecticut are required by law to report any incident of sexual abuse involving a minor or vulnerable adult. We encourage any Non-Mandated persons to report such incidents to the proper authorities as well. We support your right to do so.

Incidents involving sexual abuse of minors (persons under the age of 18) should be reported to:

Once a written report of an incident of sexual abuse of a minor or vulnerable adult has been received, an investigation will be undertaken by, or on behalf of, the Archdiocese of Hartford.
