

Words from Fr. Michael

Jealousy can be a bitter struggle. I think it affects people in vastly different ways. We can be jealous for the sake of another person. We can be jealous for attention, possessions, and reputation. We can be jealous for control.

I've heard from many people over the years, especially in the Sacrament of Penance, expressing shock when they learn that they are jealous about something. It usually begins, "Father, I never get jealous, but when this thing happened, I felt jealous in a way that I haven't before..." The same is true for me. I don't normally think of myself as envious or jealous of others, but then something will happen, and I will realize that something deep within myself had been stirred up.

For example, when I was a newly ordained priest, A friend of mine received a job from the archbishop that I had no desire to do. Yet, seeing him receive the distinction of this additional job upset me in an unexpected way. I was jealous of the trust that he had been given. I didn't want the job, I am grateful for not having had that job, yet I still struggled when it was given to someone else.

Jealousy is not so much about things, but about one's identity. Thus, in the Old Testament reading this weekend, we hear that Moses' assistant, Joshua, was jealous because God had poured out spiritual gifts on people that Joshua didn't think deserved them. It is a good situation to meditate on: Joshua was jealous for the sake of Moses. He was upset because the order of operations that he understood seemed to be violated. Joshua's jealousy is complex. Our jealousy often is as well.

In the same way, Jesus' disciples are jealous and upset that someone else, whom they didn't know, was driving out evil spirits in Jesus' name. They wanted to prevent him. Once again, the question is: what are they jealous about? That someone other than themselves can invoke the name of Jesus? That someone else is able to do great works? That God favors someone other than themselves?

Whether for attention, reputation, or control, jealousy strikes at surprising times. It is usually when our own identity, sense of worth, or place in the world is questioned. Then, all of the sudden, we learn something new about ourselves, a gift of self-knowledge. This requires us to more deeply understand who we are, and how we bring ourselves to the grace of God to heal us and instill in us our identity as beloved children.

The month of the Rosary

On October 7th, the Church celebrates the feast day of Mary, Queen of the Holy Rosary. The feast day was established by Pope Saint Pius V on the anniversary of the victory at Lepanto on October 7, 1571. The naval victory was attributed to the Virgin Mary whose intercession was entreated through the recitation of the Holy Rosary.

The Church then proceeded to dedicate the entire month of October to the Holy Rosary so that individuals, families, and communities would pray the Holy Rosary, if possible, on a daily basis for peace in the world. "Not only do we earnestly exhort all Christians to give themselves to the recital of the pious devotion of the Rosary publicly, or privately in their own house and family, and that unceasingly, but we also desire that the whole of the month of October should be consecrated to the Holy Queen of the Rosary" (Pope Leo XII; *On Devotion of the Rosary*, September 1, 1883).

This October we offer 4 ways for each of us to honor our mother Mary through the rosary.

- 1. Monday, **October 7th** at 5PM we will begin Adoration in the chapel with recitation of the rosary each hour until 6PM on **Tuesday**, **October 8th**. Today's insert describes this opportunity in more detail. There is a sign up sheet outside the parish office. We hope you will give an hour of your time.
- 2. Monday, **October 21st at 7PM** we will have a "Living Rosary". We need 60 people to represent a bead and lead a Hail Mary or Our Father in the language of their choice. Sign up sheets will be available next week
- 3. Each Tuesday from 6:00PM to 7:30PM we offer adoration of the Blessed Sacrament and the Rosary. Stop by the chapel at any point on Tuesday evening.
- 4. Finally, everyone is encourage to individually say the Rosary. Pick a time in the morning, or on a walk, or any time that works for you.

Together, let us pray for peace for the world, for our families, for each of us!
