When we pray, often we are asking God to do something. Heal this person, help this situation, restore this relationship, or assist with this project. It is an important part of prayer, asking - interceding - for others. God, though, is not an automated dispenser of per-

sonal favors. It is not a matter of just having the right words, the right formula, and then God will do what you want him to do.

We often do not understand what we are asking for. We oftentimes think we do, but the human mind sees and understands things partially, not fully. We see this in the Gospel this weekend. James and John come up to Jesus and say, "We want you to do for us whatever we ask of you." It's a bold request. Jesus doesn't turn them away, but asks a question, "What do you wish me to do for you?" Then, we see the broken understanding of James and John, they ask for themselves to be promoted, exalted, and glorified by Jesus as the "best" disciples. Jesus promptly tells them, "You do not know what you are asking." They are very sure of themselves, but they are asking without understanding. They do not know the meaning or the consequences of their request.

Even so, Jesus takes their request seriously. But he tells them how they must be changed in order to know God's glory. Service and humility, not power and praise, are the road to become like Christ. They must be changed by their request. God remains the same loving Father, but the disciples by participating in the "chalice" of Christ's passion will not be the same.

The same is true for us. If we pray in order to change God, we will be disappointed. If we pray knowing that God will change us, then a whole new world opens up for us. Persistently, patiently, praying for a person or a situation will bring dramatic change. The change begins first in the one who prays. God also works in the hearts of those we pray for. However, there is no "easy" grace which comes to us without changing us. That is because we do not fully understand what we are asking for, even when we think we do. And, God is not interested in giving us what we want, but rather to make us holy and whole.



JOIN TOGETHER AS WE PRAY THE ROSARY

Come gather and pray the rosary this Monday, October 21stat 7:00 p.m. The living rosary is one where each person represents a bead on the rosary. As each Hail Mary or Our Father is prayed, a candle is lit. This Monday's rosary will be a Scriptural Rosary, a version once prayed throughout Western Christendom in the late Middle Ages. A different little thought is assigned to each bead, so that the story of each Mystery unfolds. We will be following the Joyful mysteries with thoughts that are direct quotations from the scriptures. We need 60 people to complete the rosary. Everyone is encouraged to pray in

their own language. Please come experience this beautiful time with people of all ages gathered together in prayer.
