


LECTOR WORKSHOP

Words from Fr. Michael

On October 24th, Pope Francis published an encyclical letter entitled "*Delixit nos*," subtitled, "On the Human and Divine Love of the Heart of Jesus Christ." This letter is a big deal. Popes exercise their teaching office in various ways, there are dogmatic statements

(very rare, only two of them have been made), exhortations (usually the response to a large gathering of the church), governing letters (papal bulls and apostolic constitutions, which direct the governing of the church, e.g. assigning bishops), and Apostolic Letters (these letters are directed towards the whole Church and people of good will). The most recent document on the Sacred Heart is an Apostolic Letter directed toward the spiritual life of the whole Church.

Encyclicals are not frequent; this is only the fourth such letter Pope Francis has written over the last 11 years. Pope Benedict only wrote three encyclicals. John Paul II wrote many over his very long reign as Pope.

Of particular note to us, this latest letter concerns the Sacred Heart of Jesus. It is a letter directed towards our devotion to the Sacred Heart and the desperate need the world has for the Sacred Heart of Jesus. Over the next few weeks, I will share some of the highlights of the letter here in the bulletin.

In the first two sections, Pope Francis talks about the meaning of the word "heart." While it is the organ that pumps blood, that is not what we normally mean when we speak of the heart. Rather, we usually think of it as the place where the fullness of the human person comes together and where everything else flows from. The heart is where the intellect and desire come to meet. It is where feelings, personality, will, and understanding come together. We are not to be dominated purely by our mind nor our animal desires – all of these must pass through the heart.

We live in a time where the "mind" or the "intellect" reigns supreme. We live in a time of technology, computers, artificial intelligence, manipulation through technology, and a strong emphasis on the will. However, the mind or the intellect, even though they are essential to being human, are not the heart. You do not fall in love with an argument. You will not die for a mathematical equation. One loves from the heart, not the intellect. One is moved from the heart and not by machine logic. One becomes intimate with the core of a person – the heart – of a person, not their reasoning.

Thus, Francis writes, "In this age of artificial intelligence, we cannot forget that poetry and love are necessary to save our humanity. No algorithm will ever be able to capture, for example, the nostalgia that all of us feel, whatever our age, and wherever we live, when we recall [all of the treasured memories of our child-hood.] All these little things, ordinary in themselves yet extraordinary for us, can never be captured by algorithms." (Paragraph 20)
