SACRED HEART BOOK CLUB


The next meeting of the book club will be held on Wednesday, February 26th at 1:30. This month's book selection is "The Notebook" by Nicholas Sparks.

BLESSING OF THE THROATS

The Feast of St. Blaise, a physician who later became a bishop and died for the faith in 316 AD, will be observed on Monday, February 3, 2025. His feast is commemo-

rated with the Blessing of Throats.

In honor of St. Blaise, the Blessing of Throats will occur at the conclusion of the 8:00 a.m. Mass on Monday, February 3rd. This is an ancient custom of the Church to bless the sick, rooted in the ministry of Christ and his apostles.



Words from Fr. Michael

The Feast of the Presentation of the Lord, which we celebrate this weekend, is a beautiful event in the Church year. It is uncommon for this Feast to occur on a Sunday, averaging around once a decade.

The liturgical year allows us annu-

ally to relive the life of Christ. From his birth in Bethlehem through the cross and resurrection ending with the sending of the Holy Spirit on Pentecost. As we commemorate the Presentation, we can see similarities to Palm Sunday. The Presentation is Jesus' entrance into the city of Jerusalem and the temple for the first time. It is an arrival to the holy city. Just as Jesus arrives in Jerusalem on Palm Sunday and we commemorate his entrance in order to be sacrificed on the cross as the lamb of God, Jesus also arrives for the first time to the temple – the place of sacrifice of the Old Covenant.

His entrance into the temple, using the words we hear in the Gospel from Simeon, is the entrance of the light, or the glory of God, into the temple. Thus, the tradition begins of blessing candles as the sign of the light of Christ. This gives us the tradition of blessing the candles used on the altar for the next year on this day. For this reason, the medieval custom was to call the Presentation "Candlemas" or the Mass for blessing candles. In the same way we get "Christmas" or Christ's Mass – the Mass for Christ's birth. Until the calendar changes in 1969, the period of time between Christmas and Candlemas was considered the Christmas season and nativities and decorations were usually left on display until February second.

Therefore, we rejoice. Christ is the light of the world. He has shown his light upon our hearts and the light of his glory dwells with us in our Church. Whenever we come to worship, we have a taste of heavenly glory. May we continue to welcome and to live in his light.
