## Words from Fr. Michael

I am very grateful for all the appreciation and well wishes I received this past week as I celebrated my fortieth birthday. Thank you all. I feel very loved. And, now that my "big birthday" and "big anniversary" are past, we all should be clear

from Father Michael related celebrations for a little bit...

It is with joy that we celebrate First Communion for two young people in the parish. Whenever Sacraments are celebrated, it is an opportunity for each of us to remember the grace we have received. This weekend, take a moment to remember your first communion and to thank God for the gift of divine life that has been poured into you over the years.

The period of mourning Pope Francis is coming to an end. This week the conclave will begin. All of us should take time to pray for the cardinal-electors as they discern who the next Pope will be. It is a human event – that is, the cardinals must use their knowledge, understanding, and hopes for the future to guide them. It is also a divine event – that is, it is accompanied by fervent prayer, a great sense of responsibility, and docility to the Holy Spirit. It is easy to think of a conclave under two extremes: an intense political struggle (as depicted in the recent movie) or a purely divine action in which God directs the hands of the cardinals like puppets. Neither extreme is true. We have a role in the conclave as well. We need to pray that the cardinal-electors restrain from pride and politics and that they listen closely to each other and the Holy Spirit so that we may receive the Pope the Church needs now.

Here is a prayer that I will be praying during the preparation and the conclave: Heavenly Father, we pray in union with the whole Church for the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the Cardinals. May the cardinal-electors listen attentively to Your Spirit during the conclave. Almighty God, we pray that the conclave brings us a Pope who pleases You by guiding Your Church to grow in faithfulness to You. We pray together with the intercession of our Mother Mary and all the Saints. Please Lord, protect and guide your Church during this time of transition. Amen.




#### HAPPY MOTHER'S DAY
