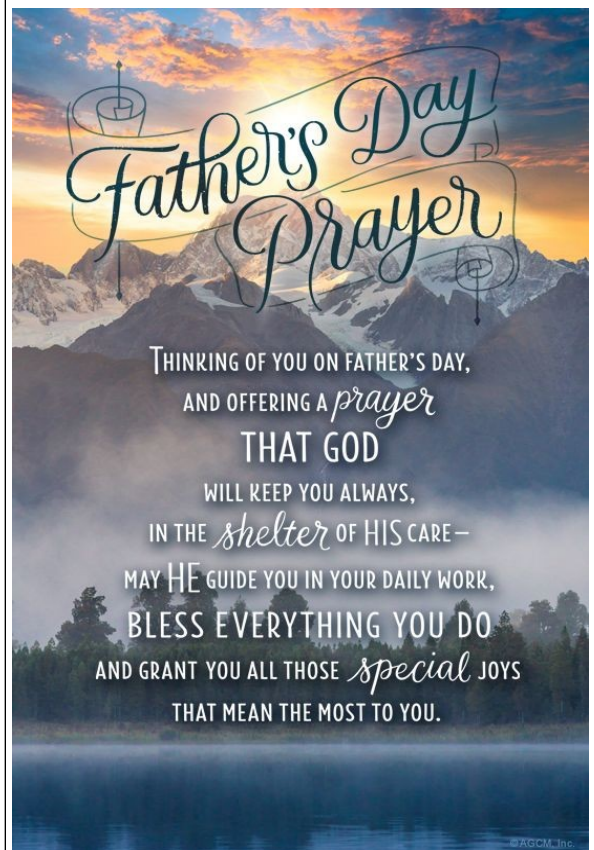

Words from Fr. Michael

Looking on the walls of the sanctuary, you will see two new friends who have been installed this past week. These last two tapestries are the last pieces of art that I commissioned to ornament our sanctuary.

The first two pieces were the two angels on the lower level who are bowing down in worship and gesturing towards the altar and tabernacle, the place where heaven and earth meet. The next pieces are the two angels on the upper level who are holding bowls of incense and joining in the worship of the Mass. This is because whenever the Mass is celebrated heaven joins in the worship of almighty God, all the Saints and angels worship with us as one body joined in prayer. Finally, the last two pieces are two human beings in glory, Blessed Michael McGivney from Waterbury and Saint Margaret Mary from France. They two are joined in the worship at Mass.

I chose to commission Blessed Michael McGivney because he is our “local guy.” Every weekend we ask him to pray for us in the Vocations Prayer. He is depicted in a very specific way. As a priest, he joins us in heavenly worship at Mass. This is why he is vested in a chasuble and is shown as if he is “con-celebrating” at the altar. He is ordained a priest of Jesus Christ forever, and his priestly service of worship and intercession for us continues in glory. His right hand is held up in blessing and in his left hand he is holding a ciborium, the Most Holy Eucharist.

The other Saint is Margaret Mary Alacoque. Her visions and writing about the Sacred Heart of Jesus were foundational in the devotion of the Church to the Sacred Heart. She died in 1690. She lived roughly 400 years ago, but her witness and love of the Heart of Jesus speak to us today. She is depicted in her religious habit, but not in the plain black of her earthly life, but her clothes and her face are luminous with the glory of God. She holds in her hands an image of the Sacred Heart inviting us to be loved by and to love the Heart of Jesus. A relic from her bones is placed in our altar, so she is present with us in our worship.

Seeing Blessed McGivney and Saint Margaret Mary joining us in worship is a reminder of the all the Saints who love us surround us, pray for us, and desire us to know the glory of heaven. With all the angels and Saints, we come before the altar of God and offer praise and thanksgiving.
