Words from Fr. Michael

We have the next great June Solemnity this weekend, the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of our Lord Jesus Christ. The origins of this celebration go back to doubts and a miracle. In 1263, a German priest who was on pilgrimage to Italy had great doubts in the truth of the faith,

particularly doubting that the Body and Blood of Jesus in the Eucharist were anything other than bread or wine. While celebrating a Mass in the Tuscan countryside wrestling with these doubts, the host dropped blood on the linen corporal on the altar. The priest's life was turned upside down and he began to proclaim his restored faith in Christ's real presence. To this day, the corporal is displayed in the cathedral in Orvieto, Italy.

Soon after this miracle, the Pope declared that there should be a feast day where we celebrate and strengthen our faith in Christ's real presence. This faith is strengthened not so much by words as it is by worship. The reverence we show to the Most Holy Eucharist is the greatest way to increase our love and proclaim our faith.

If we walk into Church and fail to recognize and reverence the presence of Christ in the tabernacle, our faith is diminished, and our love is lessened. If we walk into Church and do not see that the presence of God in the Eucharist is the greatest gift we can encounter, then our attention is drawn away from Christ. Adoration, reverence, genuflections, and silence before the wondrous gift of Christ dwelling with us is the greatest way we grow in love for God.

There is an old adage in the theology which could be paraphrased as: the way we worship proclaims what we believe. Our actions around what is holy tell us more about our faith than our words do. If we treat the Eucharist as something "ordinary" without awe-filled love, if we receive Holy Communion without preparation and an examination of conscience (and going to confession when needed), then it reflects a great poverty in our understanding of the gift God gives us. Indeed, we are poor, but Christ Jesus gives us himself in the Eucharist to make us like himself, a child of God.

HOW TO REPORT AN INCIDENT OF SEXUAL ABUSE TO THE ARCHDIOCESE OF HARTFORD

If you have knowledge or suspect that a minor or vulnerable adult (an adult with an intellectual disability) has been sexually abused, in any manner, by personnel of the Archdiocese of Hartford, you are urged to report this information to:

In addition, you will be asked to follow up in writing with a detailed description of the facts involved in the incident. Specifics of this written report can be found in the <u>Policies and Procedures of the Archdiocese of Hartford Relating to Allegations of Sexual Misconduct Involving Minors and Vulnerable Adults.</u> This document is also available online at www.archdioceseofhartford.org. The Archdiocese of Hartford will report any and all incidents to the proper civil authorities.

Mandated reporters in the State of Connecticut are required by law to report any incident of sexual abuse involving a minor or vulnerable adult. We encourage any Non-Mandated persons to report such incidents to the proper authorities as well. We support your right to do so.

Department of Social Services for the Elderly

Once a written report of an incident of sexual abuse of a minor or vulnerable adult has been received, an investigation will be undertaken by, or on behalf of, the Archdiocese of Hartford.
