### Words from Fr. Michael

Babel. In the book of Genesis, we hear an account of a city named Babel whose inhabitants desired to build a monument so magnificent and large that it would make them a civilization that would forever be known as "great." As they are in the midst of building a ziggurat, a temple that is modeled after an ar-

tificial mountain, we are told that God casts upon them a spirit of confusion so that they will be divided against themselves. This is so that the people will know that they cannot be united through human works but by the goodness of God. Babel the city's name is modeled after the sound that babies make before they learn how to talk – confused noises that do not yet signify anything.

This is the drama of broken humanity – in our pride we wish to unite ourselves, to make something great and lasting out of ourselves, to build an eternal city, culture, civilization. It is the dream of Hitler, Lenin, Napoleon, the great colonial powers of the last few hundred years, and on and on into time immemorial. One powerful leader, or idea, will be able to unite humanity, make us one, and allow us to build something eternal. The end result is always division, war, and suffering.

The reading of the coming of the Holy Spirit in the Acts of the Apostles is the answer to Babel. The Holy Spirit is poured into the hearts of believers to make of them one people – not for human pride or achievement but as a people who are God's own. This overturning of Babel is a work of God's goodness. The apostles, filled with the Holy Spirit, begin to proclaim God's glory in all languages. It is different from Babel, the idea that there is only one language. At Pentecost, the apostles speak in all the languages gathered in Jerusalem.

This is the work of God – a work we see present in the Church throughout the world. The Church is diverse, no people, race, or nation is excluded from the Gospel – it is for all. Yet, we are united as brothers and sisters in Christ, we come before the same altar, we are washed in the same font of Baptism, we receive the one Holy Spirit, and we partake of the One Lord in the Holy Eucharist. We all speak in different languages, but we understand each other and love each other. It is the work of God.

As we rejoice this Pentecost Sunday, may our temptation for human pride and selfish glory be cleansed by the joy of becoming one people, one spirit with Christ in the Holy Spirit.

So Mark Your Calendars! We hope to see you on June 29th immediately after the 10:15 Mass.






## SACRED HEART GOES TO THE YARD GOATS!
