A Note for the day

Deacon Bob

This weekend's Gospel tells us about the moment Jesus calls His first disciples—Andrew and Simon Peter, James and John. They were ordinary fishermen, working hard to provide for their families. We might think it's tough to relate to this story because in our community, we don't see many

who make their living as fisherman. However, where we can relate is with them spending time working hard to support their families. Imagine someone coming up to us asking us to give up our entire career up to follow them. When I put it in that perspective, the Apostle's answer to Jesus' call all becomes that much more impressive.

For many of us, Jesus isn't asking that of us. He is calling us to follow him as best we can. He's given us all the tools to help us with that; the Sacraments. The Holy Eucharist helps us to be intimately connected to him. The sacrament of reconciliation helps keep us on the right path. Jesus doesn't select us because of what we do, he selects us because of his love for us. Just like the disciples, he sees more in us than we see in ourselves.

My call to the diaconate was initiated by Fr. Pilon, at the time, the pastor at St. Patrick's church. He asked me a simple question: "Have you ever considered becoming a deacon?". I must admit, at the time, it was something I had never considered, but it did stir up something inside to investigate further. When I wasn't accepted on my first application, I considered that a sign that it wasn't meant to be. However, the following year Deacon Farrell asked me again and provided me with an application. Well, the rest is history as they say.

The point is that Jesus calls us every day, and we may not feel worthy of his call and frankly, we are not. But because of his love for us and the gifts he has given us, we only need to be available to say "yes" when he calls. We are his children and what we do doesn't matter. What matters is that we follow Jesus no matter how doubtful we may be.
