A Reflection to Ponder

to my sermon on Sunday so that I may show you the way to Heaven?

“You are going to show me the way to Heaven?” the boy asked, incredulously, “Why, you don’t even know the way to the post office!”

There is so much interest today in the field of astrology. Our newspapers and the internet are suffused with various writings that seek to predict or interpret the future. One of the more popular of such writings, is the daily horoscope. I know several friends for whom this is a must read. Truth be told however, there is no scientific proof that the stars affect our lives.

In the gospel reading this weekend, the Magi or wise men also engaged in star reading but with this difference, they also consulted the priests and the scribes who confirmed the forthcoming events for them.

Now, the word “epiphany” simply means manifestation. And the gospel story presents us with two manifestations. The first was the star, but its message was not complete. The astrologers had to have recourse to the scriptural knowledge of the people of Israel for its meaning. The second therefore is predicted. And so, for the wise men, it is the convergence of these two signs the singular (the star) and the predicted that guarantees the truth.

In like manner, the Lord manifests himself to each of us in two ways. We discover Him through the intimate personal communication of prayer and personal experiences, but we also discover Him through His word in Scripture through his church.

In an age such as ours, this is an important reminder for us. The fact is that we cannot go to Christ independently of his church. For an intellectual knowledge of divine revelation is not enough. We also need to have the openness of heart that will enable us, through the church, to perceive and comprehend the meanings of the unexpected and extraordinary ways of the God of surprises. Amen.
