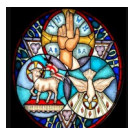

CONSECRATING THE UNITED STATES TO THE SACRED HEART OF JESUS

Consecrating the United States to the Sacred Heart of Jesus is a formal act of devotion in which the nation is "entrusted" to the love and care of Jesus, symbolizing a deep spiritual bond between the people and Christ. It is not a political act, but a spiritual dedication rooted in Catholic tradition, aiming to align the nation's life and mission with the Gospel.



In 2025 the U.S. bishops approved this consecration to coincide with the 250th anniversary of the Declaration of Independence.

One way to join the bishops is to help strengthen national unity and moral direction through prayer and Christian values. A Novena to the Sacred Heart of Jesus has been made available to those who would like to join the nation in building a society of love, justice and peace through prayer. It begins this Wednesday, June 3 and continues through June 11th.

We will continue our celebration of the Feast of the Sacred Heart on Friday, June 12th with morning Mass at 8:00 a.m. and a special prayer service at noon.

REFLECTIONS

From Fr. Stu

This weekend is the last one of May as we begin our summer journey through Ordinary Time. It's also the completion of the month of Mary, as we remember the life and example of the Blessed Mother, the first disciple of the Church who prays for us as we follow her son, our Lord Jesus.

As we usually do, we mark the special Marian months in the fall and spring as a parish with the Living Rosary. Our recent celebration was so inspiring as we joined together in prayer and scripture reflection making our way through the Glorious Mysteries. There are usually 60 disciples from our parish who encircle our worship space, sitting next to each other with rosaries in hand. Each prays either the Lord's Prayer or the Hail Mary, while I'm the "Glory be" disciple. Before each living bead is prayed (with the leader praying the first half and the rest of the folks finishing it off) we listen to a brief scripture passage of a verse or two proclaimed by one of our lectors to flesh out the particular part of the Mystery. Then, when the Hail Mary is completed for that bead, the small votive candle held by that person is lit and the scripture, prayer, candle pattern continues. Once the Living Rosary is completed, all the small candles are burning nicely, providing a gentle glow in the church. This time we also took part in the "May Crowning" of our Marian statue, with Lana and Ashley of our Confirmation students leading us as they placed the simple crown on the head. It was all so moving, so prayerful.

As I was thinking about it afterwards, the whole experience was such a vivid reflection of who we are as a church of Pentecost, filled with the Spirit and closely united to our Trinity God of Father, Son and Holy Spirit. We worship together with all the unique parts of who we are as followers of Christ, listening to God's word, fed by the Eucharist, praising God in song, nurturing community in the ways of fellowship and Gospel service. We pray in our unique devotional customs, with special prayers in our favorite language spoken or quietly lifted up. And our divine community of love and life is near, flowing into our world and into our lives with great devotion to us, the human family which, Pope Leo described as "*Magnificent Humanity*" in his recent papal teaching document (encyclical). All of who we are as human beings, our ability to love and reflect on the relationships of our lives, the ways we dialogue with one another as individuals and larger local, national and international communities, the struggles we work through and the wisdom that we gain by doing so, all of these and many other human gifts are part of the ways we follow Jesus, following the example of those first Pentecost disciples by walking through the new Spirit doors of life that await us.
