A Reflection to Ponder

There is the story of two little boys talking about their respective family situations. One of them said, “My father is a doctor. I can get sick for nothing.” And the other boy replied, “Big deal! My daddy is a minister and I can be good for nothing!”

St Paul in the second reading today, presents Jesus as the second Adam who in dying to sin and death brought humanity to victory over both. Both the Old Testament and the Gospel reading this weekend, deals with prophecy as a function of the believer in the Lord and both emphasizes the fact that the Lord will always abide with His people in the exercising of their discipleship.

Now, the chief function of a prophet is to be a messenger for the Lord. And so, my dear friends, we are all enjoined; not to stand idly by, or be a good for nothing, but to actively be our Lord’s strong representatives to the world.

All Christians are called to be witnesses. All Christians are called to be martyrs for the Lord. This means that each of us, depending on our circumstance and opportunities in life, must present to others the Good News of salvation by applying the demands of the Gospel to the situations we encounter in our daily lives.

Doing this however, even in the most prudent way possible, is bound to bring us some opposition and difficulty. It may not result in physical death for us, as has happened to many Christians before us, but there certainly will come many hardships, “cold shoulders” and loss of prestige or acceptance.

In the gospel today, our Lord assures us not to worry about these because “not a single one of our hair will be lost”. Consequently, our consolation must come from our Lord, who has promised to reward us, to recognize and acknowledge us before the God the Father. So, my dear friends let us persevere in our daily witnessing for the Lord in our world no matter the consequences we may face. Amen
