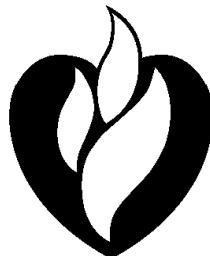

A Note for the day



Deacon Bob

This past week, we completed the consecration of our country to the **Sacred Heart of Jesus**, a moment of grace that feels especially important as we approach our nation's 250th birthday. In many ways, this conse-

cration is not only timely but necessary. Our nation has drifted far from God, and that distance has left many people confused, angry, and discouraged. When a people forget who they belong to, they lose their sense of direction — and their sense of hope.

In this weekend's Gospel, Jesus tells us that "the harvest is abundant, but the laborers are few." His words are not a lament; they are a call. A call to pray. A call to act. A call to step forward.

Consecrating our country to the Sacred Heart is one way of answering that call. It is a way of saying: *Lord, we belong to You. Heal us. Lead us. Send us.* And while we certainly pray for priestly vocations — and we should — Jesus is not speaking only of priests. The Church needs priests, yes, but the world needs disciples. The world needs witnesses. The world needs ordinary people who live extraordinary love. Every one of us is called to be a laborer in the harvest. We do that by living the commandments: loving God with all our heart, mind, and soul, and loving our neighbor as ourselves.

That is how the confused find clarity and the angry find peace. That is how the discouraged find hope. Not through arguments or force, but through the quiet, steady light of Christ shining through His people.

So, this week, yes — pray for vocations. Pray that God will raise up holy priests, deacons, and religious. But also pray that each of us may become the light of Christ for someone who feels lost. Pray that our words, our actions, and our compassion may draw others back to the Heart that never stops loving them.

May God bless you in the week ahead and may the Sacred Heart of Jesus reign in our homes, our communities, and our nation.

HOW TO REPORT AN INCIDENT OF SEXUAL ABUSE TO THE ARCHDIOCESE OF HARTFORD

If you have knowledge or suspect that a minor or vulnerable adult (an adult with an intellectual disability) has been sexually abused, in any manner, by personnel of the Archdiocese of Hartford, you are urged to report this information to:

In addition, you will be asked to follow up in writing with a detailed description of the facts involved in the incident. Specifics of this written report can be found in the [Policies and Procedures of the Archdiocese of Hartford Relating to Allegations of Sexual Misconduct Involving Minors and Vulnerable Adults](#). This document is also available online at www.archdioceseofhartford.org. The Archdiocese of Hartford will report any and all incidents to the proper civil authorities.

Mandated reporters in the State of Connecticut are required by law to report any incident of sexual abuse involving a minor or vulnerable adult. We encourage any Non-Mandated persons to report such incidents to the proper authorities as well. We support your right to do so.

Incidents involving sexual abuse of minors (persons under the age of 18) should be reported to:

Incidents involving sexual abuse of vulnerable adults aged 18 – 59 should be reported to:
*State of CT Connecticut Department of Developmental Services
AID Division for Persons with Intellectual Disabilities*

Incidents involving sexual abuse of vulnerable adults aged 60 and over should be reported to:
*State of CT Department of Social Services
Division of Protective Services for Elders*
1-888-385-4225

Once a written report of an incident of sexual abuse of a minor or vulnerable adult has been received, an investigation will be undertaken by, or on behalf of, the Archdiocese of Hartford.
